


Our Speaker Al DeRogatis

Al DeRogatis was born and educated in Newark, New Jersey, and received a scholarship to Duke University upon his graduation from Newark's Central High School, as an All-State Center. At Duke he made the All-American Team, playing in the College All-Star Game and also the East-West Shriners Game in 1949. He was drafted by the New York Football Giants the same year, after graduating from Duke. He played with them four (4) seasons, was selected as an All-Pro Tackle two years, playing in two All-Pro Games. He retired from active play in 1952 after being sidelined by an old college injury. Al then helped coach the Giants and in 1961 became a radio-analyst for their games on WNEW Radio. Subsequently he expanded his programs, co-authored a book on the Giants, before joining NBC as a free-lance game analyst in 1969.

Al had joined the Prudential Insurance Company in the Newark Agency in 1953. He was named Manager in 1965, and elected a Vice-President in 1967. In 1970 he assumed responsibility for Prudential's community affairs. Since then he has been extremely active in civic affairs, fund-raising, and Urban Recreational and Football Conferences. In 1969 Governor Cahill appointed Al to the Commission responsible for setting up the State Authority which built the Meadowlands Sports Complex.

Al is married, has two daughters, and lives in Spring Lake, N.J.



from our President

1976 was a banner year for your 200 Club.

Membership has surpassed the "200" goal, your scholarship program is moving along in fine fashion and the expanded valor awards program was graciously acknowledged by the recipients.

Through the efforts of individuals who care about those who care for us, Congress has passed the "Public Safety Officers Benefits Act of 1976." This bill will provide a death benefit of \$50,000 to the family of a law enforcement officer who is killed in the line of duty.

This bill now recognizes an obligation which we in the 200 Clubs have seen for years, and while it will diminish the pressure for our funds, it will not eliminate the need and we will continue to provide what no governmental body can; immediate and continuing personal assistance to the family after the tragedy.

The 200 Clubs Presidents Council has concluded and your Trustees have concurred that we will (1) continue immediate personal assistance to the family of a deceased public safety person, (2) fulfill our obligation to those dependents of men who were killed prior to the Federal Law becoming effective, (3) continue and expand our scholarship plans, and last, but not least of all, (4) we will manifest our appreciation to those who care for us, through our valor awards program.

These past two years have been most rewarding and satisfying to me personally, but the success and stability of this 200 Club is due to the efforts of your elected Trustees, and other members who have given so generously of their time and talents. My sincere appreciation to all for your support and efforts, and my best wishes to the new administration for continued success.
